

Learning Outcomes Assessment Quick Start Guide

This Quick-Start Guide is designed to assist units in establishing a process and plan to gather evidence of student learning in your degree programs. It is based on the information that needs to be reported in Taskstream, including sample entries, and includes links to additional resources.

Program Learning Outcomes

These outcomes are statements of what students should know and/or be able to do at the end of a degree program. The outcomes should include verbs that specify observable behaviors, such as “analyze” in the example below. Note that “understand” is not very observable. We recommend that a program have no more than five outcomes, unless an external accreditation body requires more than that.

Curriculum Map

The Curriculum Map provides an overview of where the Program Learning Outcomes are assessed, indicated by the “A”s in the table. There are also options of indicating where the outcomes are introduced to students (“I”s in the table), where students have opportunities to practice the knowledge and/or skills reflected in the outcomes (“P”s in the table), and combinations of these. Each outcome should be assessed with a minimum of one [direct measure](#) and one [indirect measure](#). In addition to identifying assessment points, the specific assignment or activity should be included, such as “Portfolio” and “Graduating Senior Survey” in the sample map.

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Process of Assessment

The Process of Assessment section is for describing how faculty and staff are involved in the development, implementation, and use of student learning outcomes. This narrative should include sufficient details to allow anyone involved in assessment of student learning to continue that assessment.

Example

The curriculum committee reviews all course proposals and modifications to ensure that the program outcomes are being addressed. There is one faculty coordinator for the program assessment who coordinates the formal assessment of the program outcomes. He/she helps to create scoring rubrics or surveys where necessary, with feedback from the entire faculty. Findings from assessments are reported to the assessment coordinator at the end of each semester. The faculty then meets once a semester to review the previous semester's findings to see whether any changes are required. If changes need to be implemented, a schedule is determined, along with who is responsible for the action.

Assessment Plan

The Assessment Plan is where the details of the measures for each outcome are recorded. Every field should be completed, to keep the plan sustainable as personnel change. Note that the scoring rubrics, exit surveys, and other tools need to be attached to the measures.

Assessment Findings

The Assessment Findings section is where each academic year’s findings are reported, by outcome and by measure. The Summary of Findings field is a text-only field; if you have charts or graphs, they can be attached to your findings. If those charts or graphs display findings from multiple measures, you only need to attach them to the first applicable measure and make a note of that in subsequent measures. Be sure to indicate the number of students who contributed to the findings in each cycle.
